Blind & Low Vision

This brochure is produced in consultation with the KPDSB and the KPDSB's Special Education Advisory Committee May 2024.

Ministry definition

The exceptionality of Blind and Low Vision is a condition of partial or total impairment of sight or vision that even with correction affects educational performance adversely.

Criteria for identification

An Identification, Placement and Review Committee **shall require** the following when considering a student with a physical exceptionality due to visual impairment:

- an ophthalmic report (visual assessment) submitted by a legally qualified ophthalmologist stating information regarding near and distant vision, field restrictions, if any, and recommendations for programming needs;
- history of academic or social/emotional difficulties directly related to the visual impairment;
- need for program modifications (Braille instruction or print material) related to visual impairment.

Please also supply this information if you can:

• health history from a legal qualified medical practitioner





KPDSB Supports

The Keewatin-Patricia District School Board employs a **Central Special Assignment Teacher for Students with Visual Impairments.** Most of this support comes through email, phone calls, and videoconferences.

In the first year of service, they will plan two team meetings to observe your child and with programming. After that, the team meetings will take place once a year.

The Central Special Assignment Teacher for Students with Visual Impairments:

- helps the Special Education Resource Teacher and the classroom teacher implement recommendations from W. Ross Macdonald School and Vision Loss Rehabilitation Ontario (VLRO)
- recommends resources and where to find them
- provides training and support on Braille and technology use
- raises accessibility awareness
- models interventions
